FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

My dear Parishioners,

"Ten were cleansed, were they not? Where are the other nine?"

The story is told of a mother who took her three children to a restaurant to eat breakfast one morning. The smallest of the three children sat at the very end of the row. She saw other people being served and eating right away without stopping to say thanks. It surprised her. When the food was served to her, she shouted out to her mother: "Mommy, don't people ask for blessing in this place?" You can well imagine the embarrassment of those present. Her mother tried to hush her. But, the waitress said to little Mary, "Yes, we do, sister! You give thanks!" Amazingly, at that very moment, everybody else also bowed their heads and offered thanks.

The Readings of today invite us to reflect on giving God thanks. In the First Reading, Naaman, the Syrian army general, was not only an outcast because of his leprosy but also a non-Israelite. After he was healed, he came to thank Prophet Elisha for the cure and, as a sign of his gratitude, transferred his allegiance to the God of Israel. In the Gospel Reading, Jesus heals ten lepers. Of the ten, nine were Jews and one was Samaritan. It was the Samaritan who came back to thank Jesus. Like the parable of the Good Samaritan, Jesus holds out the Samaritan as a model of faith and gratitude.

Do we remember to thank God? Or do we take the love of God for granted? God showers gratuitous love upon us each day in many varied ways. Indeed, God's steadfast love never ceases, and His faithfulness never comes to an end. They are new every morning. Do we give thanks to God for all His blessings? Sometimes we take giving thanks before eating for granted.

God wants us to develop the virtue of gratitude because He wants us to experience the joy that comes from knowing He loves us without limits or conditions. Our blessings are a result of His mercy. They are never our right. Let us, therefore, live our lives in thanksgiving. As the Psalmist prays: "Give thanks to the Lord, for He is good. For His love endures forever." Let the sons of Israel say His love endures forever. Let those who fear the Lord say His love endures forever (Psalm 118). Make this week a week of thanksgiving. Thank God for every moment of your life because it is a gift.

I urge you to continue praying the Holy Rosary.

Our Lady's Holy Rosary is a powerful prayer. After all, the Blessed Virgin herself gave it to the faithful as a spiritual weapon.

These quotes about the Rosary from holy men and women throughout the history of the Church illustrate and speak to the power of this prayer.

"The word rosary means "Crown of Roses," that is to say that every time people say the Rosary devoutly they place a crown of one hundred and fifty-three white roses and sixteen red roses upon the head of Jesus and Mary. Being heavenly flowers these roses will never fade or lose their exquisite beauty."

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q. I find it difficult to concentrate on the words and elements of the Rosary prayers. Is there a strategy you'd recommend that can help me pray more meditatively and without distractions?

- **A.** First, bear in mind that according to science, the ability of the brain to concentrate without distraction varies for different people, ranging from 10 to 90 minutes; and depending on factors such as age, motivation, environment, and the nature of the task. From this, we can deduce two lessons:
- (a) It is not unusual to experience momentary lapses in concentration while praying the Rosary;
- (b) It is possible to improve the attention span and quality of our meditative, contemplative, disposition towards praying the Rosary. A useful resource on praying the rosary better is Pope Paul VI's 1974 apostolic exhortation on Marian devotion in which he invites us to "meditate on the mysteries of the Lord's life as seen through the eyes of her who was closest to the Lord. In this way the unfathomable riches of these mysteries are unfolded" (Marialis Cultus 47). Without this disposition, "the Rosary is a body without a soul, and its recitation is in danger of becoming a mechanical repetition of formulas" (Marialis Cultus 47).

As the Pope reminds us, each of the various elements of the Rosary "has its own particular character which, wisely understood and appreciated, should be reflected in the recitation in order that the Rosary may express all its richness and variety. Thus the recitation will be grave and suppliant during the Lord's Prayer, lyrical and full of praise during the tranquil succession of Hail Marys, contemplative in the recollected meditation on the mysteries, and full of adoration during the doxology" (Marialis Cultus, 50).Bottomline: The value of prayer lies in the will; and certainly the "effectual fervent" will to pray without distraction is edifying and "availeth much" (Jas 5:16).
