

"DILEXI TE". WE MUST NOT LET OUR GUARD DOWN
WHEN IT COMES TO POVERTY

INTRODUCTION

The Apostolic Exhortation of Leo XIV, initiated by Pope Francis, retraces the teaching of the Church from Jesus and the early saints to the popular movements and works of charity: "Love for our neighbor is tangible proof of the authenticity of our love for God."

In profound continuity with the Encyclical Delexit nos, in which Pope Francis developed the inexhaustible mystery of the divine and human love of the Heart of Christ, the document begins from the words of the Lord: "I have loved you" (Rev 3:9) and wants to point out the strong connection that exists between the love of Christ and his call for us to draw near to the poor.

- 1. "I have loved you" (Rev 3:9). The Lord speaks these words to a Christian community that, unlike some others, had no influence or resources, and was treated instead with violence and contempt: "You have but little power... I will make them come and bow down before your feet" (Rev 3:8-9). This text reminds us of the words of the canticle of Mary: "He has cast down the mighty from their thrones, and lifted up the lowly; he has filled the hungry with good things, and sent the rich away empty" (Lk 1:52-53).
- 2. This declaration of love, taken from the Book of Revelation, reflects the inexhaustible mystery that Pope Francis reflected upon in the Encyclical Dilexit Nos on the human and divine love of the heart of Jesus Christ. There we saw how Jesus identified himself "with the lowest ranks of society" and how, with his love poured out to the end, he confirms the dignity of every human being, especially when "they are weak, scorned, or suffering." As we contemplate Christ's love, "we too are inspired to be more attentive to the sufferings and needs of others, and confirmed in our efforts to share in his work of liberation as instruments for the spread of his love."

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q. I get the explanation you gave about the scriptural basis of the Rosary. But, in that case, why don't we just read the Bible instead of praying the Rosary?

A. Because reading the Bible per se is not the same as, or a substitute for, prayer. And the whole essence of the rosary is prayer! The Rosary is, in the words of Regis Flaherty, "a bouquet of prayers offered to God." What is important to reiterate, though, is that the Rosary and the Bible are not mutually exclusive. On the contrary; given that the Rosary is rooted in Sacred Scripture, there would be no Rosary without the Bible; and praying the Rosary only magnifies the Lord in our soul.

The Rosary invites us to better know and love Christ by contemplating the mysteries of our redemption. By reflecting on these mysteries, we not only increase our understanding of the life and ministry of Christ; we can also discover how God is calling us to live our own lives. Through the Rosary, Jesus can speak into our hearts, saying the words he spoke to Martha: "Martha, Martha, you are anxious and troubled about many things, but one thing is necessary" (Lk. 10:41).

There are many other reasons to pray the Rosary, including the following. The Bible exhorts us to "Ask, seek, knock" (Matt. 7:7); constantly and persistently (Rom. 12:12; Eph. 6:18; 1 Thes. 5:17). The Rosary is a prayer of a deliberately high quantum of repetition, hence a great prayer for persistence (cf. the parable of the persistent widow in last Sunday's gospel Lk 18:2-8). Secondly, the Rosary is highly established as a means of incorporated, or communal, prayer; as has been commended to us by Scripture (Matt. 18:19-20). Furthermore, the Church believes that the Blessed Mother of God continues exercising her maternal office in Heaven. And there are hundreds of testimonies from the lips and lives of saints down the years that illustrate and justify this conviction.


